**ORDER – Accident**

Whereas B 737-800 aircraft VT-SYK, of M/s Spice Jet, while operating a scheduled flight for sector Jaipur to Mumbai, met with an accident at Mumbai on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019.

And, whereas it appears to the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB), India that it is expedient to investigate and determine the probable cause(s) and contributory factor(s) leading to the accident and make recommendations to avoid recurrence of such accident in future.


Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Rule 11 (1) of the Aircraft (Accident and Incidents Investigation) Rules 2017, the Director General-AAIB, India hereby orders an Investigation of the said accident to find out the probable cause(s).

The Director General-AAIB, India hereby appoints Sh. R S Passi, Director, AAIB as Investigator – in – Charge. He will be assisted by Capt. Gaurav Pathak, and Dr. K. N. Rao as Investigator(s) to inquire into the circumstances of this accident.

The Investigator-in-Charge may take the assistance of other experts/agencies whenever required.

The headquarters of the Investigation will be at New Delhi.

The Investigator-in-Charge will complete its inquiry and submit the report to AAIB, India, preferably within four months from the date of issue of this order.
