**ORDER – Serious Incident**

Whereas Boeing 737-800 aircraft VT-SGJ, of M/s Spicejet Ltd, while operating a scheduled flight for sector Delhi-Shirdi, met with a serious incident at Shirdi Airport on 29<sup>th</sup> of April 2019.

And, whereas it appears to the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB), India that it is expedient to investigate and determine the probable cause(s) and contributory factor(s) leading to the serious incident and make recommendations to avoid recurrence of such incident in future.

Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Rule 11 (1) of the Aircraft (Accident and Incidents Investigation) Rules 2017, the Director General-AAIB, India hereby orders an Investigation of the said serious incident to find out the probable cause(s).

The Director General-AAIB, India hereby appoints Sh. K Ramachandran, Assistant Director, AAIB as Investigator – in – Charge. He will be assisted by Sh. Amit Kumar, Safety Investigation Officer, AAIB & Capt. Priti Kohal, Operations Expert as Investigators to inquire into the circumstances of this serious incident.

The Investigator-in-Charge may take the assistance of other experts/agencies whenever required.

The headquarters of the Investigation will be at New Delhi.

The Investigator-in-Charge will complete its inquiry and submit the report to AAIB, India, preferably within four months from the date of issue of this order.
